Important Attendance Update – New Penalty Notice Rules from Hampshire County Council.

We want to make all families aware of a **significant change** to Hampshire County Council's guidance on school attendance.

Penalty Notices can now be issued even if your child has fewer than 10 unauthorised absences.

This includes:

- Repeated absences for family events or special occasions.
- Term-time holidays that are disguised as illness or planned around INSET days

This is not a school decision. We are required to follow the new guidance issued by the local authority.

Our attendance policy has been updated to reflect these changes and will apply to all absences from **10 October 2025 onwards**.

Please be honest when reporting absences. If your child is on holiday, do not report them as sick. Always complete a Leave of Absence form in advance.



Online Safety

This half-terms Online Safety newsletter's focus is Privacy and Security.

This is about behavioural and technical strategies to limit impact on privacy and protect data and systems against compromise.





Our Schools' Acceptable User Policies (AUP)

In school this half term, children have read and signed Acceptable User Policies which are designed to keep children safe whilst using technology. They highlight the do's and dont's of using all technology in school and shows how we want pupils to behave when using IT. The AUPs have a section covering security, passwords and copyright. These rules include: keeping passwords and log-in details private, not installing files onto the school network and ensuring images they use are non-copyrighted. As well as this, children agree not to share personal information and making sure images do not give this information away.

To support parents in knowing where to start when it comes to keeping your children safe online, the team at internet matters.org have created the ABC online safety checklist.

Activate



Activate parental controls

Use the controls and tools available from broadband providers, online platforms and apps to install safe search settings, block inappropriate content and prevent contact from strangers.

Balance



Balance screen time

Agree a good balance for your children's screen time, taking education and leisure content into account. Encourage active screen time over passive and consider setting limits for the total hours spent online each day.

Check



Check and chat

Check which apps your children use and the relevant age limits for each platform. And talk regularly about online safety and what they might come across so you can work together to manage any risks and keep online experiences positive.

Not only does this tool cover privacy and security through activating parental controls, the checklist gives pointers to help balance screen time and also some ideas for conversation starters.






SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL HEEDS

A child or young person has special educational needs if they have a learning difficulty or disability which calls for special educational provision to be made for him or her.

(SEND Code of Practice)



Graduated Approach:

Many children across the Federation take part in a variety of interventions to meet their individual needs.

Wave 1: Inclusive, high quality teaching for all.

Wave 2: Additional interventions to enable children to work at age related expectations

Wave 3: Additional highly personalised interventions.

For some children this will be a small catch up group, others may receive 1:1 emotional support, and some may receive a more intensive programme of support.

We follow the assess, plan, do, review cycle to ensure a person-centred approach, maximising each child's potential. Teachers meet regularly to plan provision for children.

We've also received lots of emails about other sporting successes — it's brilliant to see so many other activities happening beyond school.


All club achievements are celebrated in class or assembly and added to the Wall of Fame.






