

# The Romans

Here are some activities linked to each of our subjects and the objectives we cover.

You are expected to complete all of these home learning activities. They need to be completed to the best of your ability and remember that presentation is very important!

## **History**

Create a fact file to explain what the Romans did for Britain and how it impacts our lives today.

If you have the resources, create a model of a Roman temple looking at the different architecture.

Choose a Roman invention. Draw a labelled diagram to show how it works.

Choose the one thing that interests you the most about the Romans and create a song/poem or rap to explain it. Record/write down your composition or perform it at school.

## **English**

Write a short newspaper article announcing the invasion of Britain.

Write a diary entry from someone living in a British village that gets invaded by the Romans.

Write your own acrostic poem about something Roman.

Make up a crossword using only nouns. Write down a word related to the Romans for each letter of the alphabet. Then write a sentence about each one to explain it!

Write three different sentences using all the following words:  
Centurion, citizen, emperor.

## **French**

Learn how to write the names of different sports in French and write some sentences.

## **Geography**

Draw a map of Italy and label five different cities.

Look at the movement of the Romans and how they got their empire. Create a poster to present your findings.

## **PE**

Create an outdoor game for Roman children to play and write some instructions on how to play it.

Create a Roman style dance thinking about the story that would be told through dance.

## **Computing**

Download Scratch (free app/programme) on to your computers and use the blocks to make things happen. E.G. make two characters have a conversation, programme the background to change. Be creative and have fun with it!

## **PSHE**

Explore the effect of global warming on pollution levels since the Romans.

## **Maths**

Write out the number bonds to 20 using Roman Numerals.

Create a symmetrical mosaic tile using cut out 2D shapes.

Create a poster to help someone learn their times table. It could include finding patterns or using doubling and halving.

Use Purple Mash to practise and prepare for the times table test.

## **Music**

Create a piece of music using body percussion (parents have to join in).

Create a call and response pattern using homemade instruments.

## **RE**

Jesus and his teachings  
Write a story with a message that Jesus might have told.

Initiation  
Create your club and come up with rules, initiation process and a symbol to represent your club. What is the aim of the club?

## **Guided Reading**

Do some home reading each night. Try to read some texts that are in different forms - e.g. newspapers, magazines, TV timetables, calendars, weather maps, letters, instructions, recipes etc. Record two things that you have read each week.

## **Design Technology**

Find a roman savoury recipe and make it, take a photo of your creation (if you can get the ingredients).
