

The Romans

Here are some activities linked to each of our subjects and the objectives we cover. **This should take you 4 weeks to complete.** You are expected to complete all of these home learning activities. They need to be completed to the best of your ability and remember that presentation is very important!

History

Create a list of things that we would use now that the Romans used and a list of objects that we do not use now.

Create a Roman timeline.

Create a poster advertising a Roman museum collection (this can be done on the computer).

Using items in your house, dress up as someone from Roman times. Have your photo taken and write a caption to go with it.

Create a leaflet about a Roman artefact for a museum.

Play a game imagining the Romans were invading - how would you feel as a Roman? How were the Romans organised? How would you feel as a Celt?

English

Write a short newspaper article announcing the invasion of Britain. You will need to think of a catchy headline and whether you are writing as a Roman or British.

Write a diary entry from someone in a British village, which is taken over by the Romans.

Create a job advert for someone to work as a servant in a Roman villa.

Write your own Roman poem.

Write a description about arriving at one of the Roman villas to work for an important Roman leader.

Make a list of 10 adjectives to describe a Roman emperor.

French

Write down what you like to do in your spare time in French.

CHALLENGE: Can you put it into sentences?

Geography

Plan a trip across the UK visiting only Roman towns. **CHALLENGE:** Can you use any Roman roads?

Draw the flags for every country that the Romans invaded.

PE

Create an outdoor game for Roman children to play.

Using objects in your home or your garden create a circuit for you and a family member to complete.

Computing

Create a Roman play/production and film it for the class to see.

Complete the daily activities set on Purple Mash. There is a link on the left hand side called **Weekly Activities**. Follow this link for daily set tasks.

Maths

Write a list of addition and subtraction number sentences using Roman numerals. **CHALLENGE:** Can you turn this into a maths work sheet for children?

Design a roman maze using reflective symmetry.

Using decimals create some word problems for your classmates to complete.

Create a game using the four different operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).

Practise your times tables on Purple Mash.

Can you draw a picture using the following lengths?
5cm, 16cm and 29cm.

Music

Follow the set tasks on Purple Mash for Music.

Use resources at home to create your own piece of music (pots and pans, cutlery, keys etc.).

Guided Reading

Find a page of information about the Romans, either on the internet or in a book. Summarise this information in 30 words.

Read to an adult and get them to ask you questions about what you have read throughout and after.

Art

Draw/paint a picture of something from the Roman times e.g. a Roman banquet, a Roman building, chariot racing. Write a caption to go with it.

Research Roman mosaic vases and then design your own.

PSHE

Research the role of parliament and what they do. Create a PowerPoint to share what you find.

Does having more things make us happier? Create arguments for and against.

RE

Research the Roman Gods. Create a leaflet/poster to explain your favourite and justify your choice. Think about the following questions. What does the God represent?

How was he worshipped?

Design Technology

Make your own Roman coins.

Design and make (if you have the resources) a Roman outfit for a slave or a rich person.

Make a 3D model of an item from the Roman times.
