PHSE

Remember all the ways you have learned to relax and keep mentally healthy during our yoga sessions. Spend 10 minutes a day practicing a breathing or stretching technique.

D.T./Art

Make a collage or draw a picture, showing a longboat on a stormy sea.

History

Research King Alfred and explain how you think things could have been different if he was never born. Compare the similarities and differences between how the rich and poor dressed in Anglo-Saxon times. Create a timeline for the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings, showing how they overlapped and interacted.

Geography

Draw a map to show the Anglo-Saxons invasion (where the Anglo-Saxons came from and where they ended up). Explain why you think they left their previous homes and why they chose to come to Britain.

Maths

Revise and practice the four operations + - x ÷

Revise and practice adding fractions with the same and different denominators.

Practise telling the time using the 24 hour format.

Design a symmetrical Viking shield.

R.E.

Re-tell the story of Buddha in any way you choose, some examples include: through a performance, a PowerPoint or a leaflet.

Music

The Viking Gods were important in Viking story telling: Thor, Loki, Odin Freya.. There is a set of animations which tell you the stories online and then teach you songs for each story too. English

Write a diary account as if you are an ancient Briton living in a town that has been invaded by the Vikings. Create a leaflet about Viking gods and goddesses. Write a Viking saga.

Science

Using a pulley or gear system, design a piece of equipment that could have been used for Anglo-Saxon farming to make their lives easier.

P.E.

Vikings had to be fit and strong. Create a Viking exercise regime and share it with somebody.

Computing

Create a Viking 'True or False?' quiz, you could use Scratch or PowerPoint to do this.

Create a presentation about e-safety, explaining how you can keep yourself safe online.
