Are there any other strategies you could teach your grown-up? (bubble strategy, splitting a number into tens and units, using your number bonds)	Research the artists Piet Mondrian and Roy Lichenstein and create a piece of artwork based on each of their work.
<b>BIG MATHS!</b> Continue practising your arithmetic accuracy and fluency with Big Maths. Big Maths BEAT THAT is available online for everybody to access - link on the school website.	Find out who Neil Armstrong was and why he is so well known.	Ask your grown-up to sign up to Oxford Owl (it's free!) and read 3 books from the colour band you are on. You could write a review of your favourite book.
Help your grown-up to bake by following a recipe. You can be in charge of measuring out the right ingredients accurately.	Make a poster to explain what an adjective, noun, verb and adverb are.	Do a Joe Wicks workout with someone in your family (available on Youtube).
